### **WE DID IT!**

The challenges of the pandemic have continued to impact Tara's Chance. Following the Southern California stay at home order on December 6th, we paused our program but not our mission. We created our first ever Christmas Drive Thru for our riders and their families. Together 8 staff members, 8 volunteers. 2 board members, and 6 horses brought joy to our 32 riders and their families. Our riders drove through a holiday decorated ranch, saw and petted their therapy horses, grabbed a stocking, took a photo with Santa, and heard their favorite carols. The smiles and joy of our riders and their families made the event a complete success. We also created our first ever Christmas Fundraising Campaign. I would like to say a huge thank you to our staff, board, and volunteers who put the campaign together. Tara's Chance relies on community support from donors like you and we are all very grateful for your contribution. We successfully raised \$2,400 for our program! Thank you! These funds enable us to continue our mission on the road by trailing out to see our riders on a weekly basis. Based on this week's pandemic data, researchers at Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health have said that we have reached the holiday peak and are heading to a better place. This is wonderful news and as soon as it is safe for our program to resume, we will be back in the saddle. Until then, stay safe.

Tara's Chance has been thankful to have the support of our community and country through both rounds of the PPP Loan distributions. We were able to continue to pay our staff and to care for our therapy horses during the early pandemic because of the first round PPP loan and community support. Our first PPP loan is pending forgiveness and we have applied for a second through US Bank. I would like to thank Francine Flores and Matt Ramirez from US Bank, Leslie Sorrells, Nancy Capel, and Amy Davis for all their hard work helping Tara's Chance receive this needed aid while programming has been paused.
