Program Director Update

We completed our expansion on the arena! The addition has been much needed for our horses to exercise and to create more space to serve our riders. There are so many things to consider when taking on a project like this, many changes and obstacles but we are almost there! The extra space gives us room to move when our riders are distracted by outside sounds.

We are able to move away from distractions and change their environment to increase focus. It also gives us more room to play ball with riders, which is one of the most physical, fun, and engaging movements they do. It also helps with safety by keeping the horses more distant during our lessons and being further away from potential sounds that horses dislike. Our horses enjoy the extra space to run in when turned out to play. Before the expansion they only had the opportunity to run more than 100 feet in our lower arena. However, the lower arena is not always accessible due to weather and muddy conditions when it rains. Since this arena is 30 feet above the lower arena it floods less and thus our horses have the opportunity for more exercise more frequently.

Another update is that we have a few new four legged friends to add to our program! I am excited to introduce Big Oliver, who is over 17 hands tall and Patrick and Cowboy who are two miniature horses.
